## <u>Instructions for Casa P Block</u>

Assemble each row in the order indicated. Sew rows together to complete block. Remove paper.

Add applique if desired.

Makes a 10" finished block.

## Tips and Tricks

Fussy cut pieces to add movement to your block. Nature prints and florals with small to medium motifs work well in the foreground (row 1, piece 2) and as shrubbery next to the house (row 2, pieces 1 and 5).

Choose prints with swirling or round motifs for the sky to add dimension to the background (row 3, pieces 1 and 2).

Geometric prints work well for the house and the sidewalk (row 2, pieces 2, 3 and 4; row 1, pieces 2, 3 and 4).

Use embroidery to add extra touches such as house numbers or names down the supporting walls of the house (row 2, pieces 2 and 4).

NOTE: This pattern requires a knowledge of paper piecing techniques. Paper Piecing How To can be found easily on the Internet by Googling "paper piecing how to". For a video of paper piecing, search You Tube for paper piecing or foundation piecing.


Casa P A House Block

Row 1 Foreground


Use the same fabric for pieces 2, 3 and 4
